December: Published a greenhouse gas inventory for Lancaster County.



2022 Highlights to date:

Moving into 2022, we've made some incredible strides in bringing RegenAll's vision into the community. So far in 2022 we have:

- Secured a pivotal \$50,000 seed grant for our work from the High Foundation.
- Helped four Lancaster County businesses begin drafting Climate Action Plans.
- Began working with public sector partners - including the William Penn Foundation and the Center for Coalfield Justice - to support climate action work in communities and municipalities that are home to more than 8.4 million people.
- Hosted listening sessions with the City of Lancaster to help residents shape climate action and the City's updated Comprehensive Plan.
- Launched our Community Climate Fund. Through our Community Climate Fund, Lancaster households and businesses can offset their carbon emissions and support sustainability projects in their communities, including home energy retrofits, rooftop solar, and regenerative farming.
- Began building a professional staff, including our Community Climate Fund Director, Leilani Richardson, and Chief Climate Strategist, Franklin Egan. We also have a network of more than 20 dedicated volunteers and advisors.
- Organized a volunteer Community Climate Fund Committee to provide strategy and oversight for the Fund.
- Organized a volunteer Outreach Committee to help educate and engage Lancaster households and organizations.
